## Service Marks Authorized

The government of the Turks & Caicos Islands adopted in April the Trade Marks (Amendment) Act 2000 which provides that:

- Service marks may be registered in the jurisdiction;
- International Classes 35-42 are added for registration of service marks; and
- A mark may be assigned or transferred either with or without the goodwill of the business with which the mark is associated.

The Turks & Caicos Islands are a British Dependent Territory in which applications for trademarks can be filed either locally or based upon a current UK registration.
